Flu vaccinations

Please do contact Reception if you have not yet had your flu vaccination.

The flu vaccine remains the best defence we have against flu and protects those people who are most vulnerable.

Certain groups of people are at higher risk from flu, including adults aged 65 and over, those with underlying health conditions, pregnant women, and frontline health and social care workers. In 2019/20, the flu vaccination is being offered to:

- those aged 65 years and over
- those aged 6 months to under 65 years in clinical risk groups
- pregnant women
- those living in a residential or nursing home
- the main carer of an older or disabled person
- children aged 2-3 (on 31 August 2019) and all primary school aged children
